Ever-ready. There are so many technologies available whose focus is to help us be prepared for all eventualities; we have advance security systems for our homes, we have apps for everything from predicting the weather to alerting us to traffic delays. There were no such luxuries in the parables. The men who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding feast cannot afford to sleep. They won't receive an alert to their mobile phone when their master arrives home. In the short parable of the householder and the burglar, Jesus again emphasises the importance of "standing ready". Of course Jesus is really talking about spiritual alertness. It might seem morbid but ask yourself this "If you were to die tonight, would you be ready? Your answer might tell you something about the areas of your life that need work. Another way in which we can be "ever-ready" is to be open to the Holy Spirit. Then, we are more likely to see God's goodness in those we meet and be ready to welcome his grace into our lives. We cannot imagine being without our gadgets and apps but valuable though they are, there is something more valuable — indeed priceless - at stake

GOD-INCIDENCES: Fr Goyo Hidalgo is a Catholic priest ministering in California. In June he experienced one of those "God-incidences" where a mistake helped him reach out to someone in need. Fr Goyo had intended to call a parishioner who had left him a message but there was no answer, so he left a message on voicemail saying "This is Fr Goyo. I know you needed to talk. I'm here" He had no idea he hadn't called the person he intended to contact so he wasn't surprised when the phone rang two minutes later. However the voice on the other end of the phone wasn't the parishioner he thought he had called but an unknown man who said "I have wanted to talk to a priest for a very long time but I was too nervous. How did you know"" As Fr Goyo explained, he didn't know; he'd simply dialled a wrong number. In a local radio interview Fr Goyo said that this co-incidence was meaningful to him because it happened on his last day in the first parish and the transition was difficult for him. He was tempted not to make the call because he was going to be "out there tomorrow" He made the call anyway, accidently dialling an area code for New York instead of California. Fr Goyo said "The person I ended up talking to was praying for a sign, that someone would reach out to him. He need a lot of spiritual help, and so did I so I guess in a way God took care of both of us at the same time." Among the people who responded to the story, several told stories of coincidences that helped them to rediscover their faith after being far from the church for a long time. One woman told him "I came back to the church after an absence of 10 years, after feeling convinced I had to visit a Catholic Church. It was a Saturday. I had no intention of seeing a priest. I had no idea the church had only just been opened up for confessions and the priest there spotted meBeyond a doubt God uses ordinary circumstances and coincidences to work extraordinary things. Fr Goyo told the radio that he likes to call God a "gentle tornado, because he does amazing things we can't believe without pushing us to the extreme". May that wind always blow in
