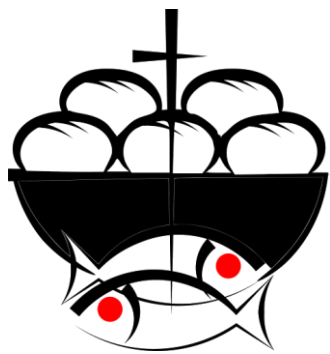

The parable in today's Gospel features a narrow door and a locked door, as well as an unsympathetic doorkeeper - it's almost as if the master want to keep everyone out! People knock on the door and expect to be admitted, but it's not that simple. The master turns them away, claiming not to know them, despite protestations that they are acquainted. Jesus is trying to teach his followers about discipleship. What does he mean when he says we must "enter by the narrow door"? Is it almost impossible to enter the kingdom of God? One thing is sure: a passing acquaintance with Jesus will not be enough. The pleas of "We once ate and drank in your company" is feeble. It is not enough to know Jesus only on the surface – to attend Mass every Sunday or to turn to him only when we are in need. To really know Jesus, one must walk the narrow path of the Gospel.

Catholic Grandparents Association **ANNUAL NATIONAL GRANDPARENTS PILGRIMAGE** September 8th 2019, Knock Shrine 2.30pm. Everybody welcome to honour and thank Grandparents alive and dead; for all they have done for us down through the ages. Chief Celebrant is Bishop of Elphin; Kevin Doran - Combined Choirs of Knock Parish - Dana will sing 'Our Lady of Knock'

Shrines such as **KNOCK AND LOUGH DERG** can lead to a rebirth of the Church in Ireland, the Pope's leading adviser on evangelisation has said. It comes as the number of pilgrims at both **Knock and Lough Derg** are up on previous years. Fr La Flynn told the *Irish Catholic* that after a decade of decline, "We held firm with our numbers from last year and actually increased by a few score" Fr Flynn said that he "was pleased to share my sense that the three-day pilgrimage season which ended last Thursday, August the 15th was filled with grace and fruitfulness on so many levels". It was a similar situation at Knock where Fr Richard Gibbons confirmed that "this year the numbers are very, very good and definitely up on last year" Fr Gibbons said "The numbers on 15th August in particular were excellent – the best we've had in a few years; the Mass at 3pm was jammed" He described the family day of the novena as "massively uplifting" Meanwhile more than 1,000 young people attended the annual **Youth 2000** summer festival in Co Kildare.
