On 10 October 2020 Pope Francis beatified 15 year old Carlo Acutis who died in 2006 making the teen the first of what we call the millennial generation to have been acknowledged in this way. Carlo loved football, video games and had a sweet tooth. Carlo was from a family that were not particularly religious. Carlo however used to attend Mass with other members of the family and once he saved up to buy a sleeping bag for a homeless man that he often saw on the way to the church. He developed a true passion for the Eucharist which he called his "highway to heaven" and at age 11 used his computer skills to create a website that traced the history of all the known Eucharistic miracles, that has since been used by more than 10.000 parishes through the world, (miracolieucaistici.org) He once asked his mother why sports stadiums were so full of people and churches so empty. He would say "they have to see, they have to understand". His mother experienced a deep conversion herself. In the summer of 2006 Carlo asked his mother did she think he should become a Priest. When he went back to school he wasn't feeling unwell and was diagnosed with an untreatable form of leukaemia. He died shortly afterwards and people were amazed at his funeral to see the number of the city's poorer people who came to the ceremony and spoke of his generosity and kindness. His mother said "He is being a Priest from Heaven". Carlo used to say to his young friends; "be an original not a photocopy" encouraging them to be free of the slavery to the usual fads and fashions that so often lead to unhappiness. **Blessed Carlo Acutis, pray for all the young people of our Parish.**
