May Novena starting on Monday 5th to Tuesday 13th May in St Joseph's Church, Monaghan. Rosary at 7pm followed by the Holy mass at 7.30pm. Special Mass on Sunday the 11th of May at 2pm for the sick.

The Papal Conclave. On 7th May 2025, the Cardinals of the Catholic Church will meet in Rome for the 2025 Conclave. The word conclave comes from the Latin words *cum clavis*, meaning *with a key*. This refers to the process of the Cardinals being separated from the world, both physically and technologically, until a Pope is elected. They remain in the Sistine Chapel in Vatican City and the adjoining accommodation building, which is called *Domus Santa Marta*.

The title *Cardinal* is an honorary title, given to the most senior Bishops in the Church. There are approximately 5,600 Bishops in the world, but there are only 252 Cardinals. Only those Cardinals who are below the age of 80 can vote in a Conclave. There are 135 eligible electors, however, a few may be absent due to sickness. The Irish Church does not have a Cardinal who is eligible to vote in this Conclave. Our only living Cardinal, Cardinal Sean Brady, is over the age of 80. Our nearest Cardinal is Cardinal Vincent Nichols, who is the Archbishop of Westminster and leader of the Catholic Church in England and Wales.

On Wednesday 7th, there will be a special Mass to begin the conclave, celebrated by the Dean of the College of Cardinals, Giovanni Battista Re, who also celebrated Pope Francis' funeral Mass. The cardinals enter the Sistine Chapel in the afternoon, take an oath of fidelity and secrecy, and then begin the voting process. One vote will be cast on that afternoon, and after that up to four votes may be cast each day until a candidate reaches the mandatory two-thirds majority.

Famously, smoke is released through a special chimney at the end of each vote. Chemical cannisters are used to colour the smoke. Black smoke signifies that no Pope has been elected. White smoke and the ringing of bells mark the successful election of a Pope. It's important to note that the Cardinals do not elect a successor to Pope Francis, but rather a successor to St. Peter, the first Pope, as mandated by Jesus Christ. (Matthew 16:18). The next Pope will be the 267th Successor of St. Peter.

Soon after a Pope is elected, he will be vested in his Papal Robes, choose a Papal Name and then be introduced to the world from the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, overlooking St. Peter's Square in Rome, with the latin words *Annuntio vobis, gaudium magnum; habemus Papam,* which translates as *I announce to you with great joy; we have a Pope.* He will then speak to the world and impart his blessing. Please take a moment over the next few days to pray that God's will is done in the choosing of our next Pope.
