#### Prayer for Pope Leo XIV

Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd Pope Leo XIV a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love. By governing with fidelity those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the Apostle Peter and Vicar of Christ, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love and peace for all the world. Amen.

### POPE LEO XIV

We give thanks to God for the election of a new pope to lead the worldwide Catholic Church. Robert Francis Prevost was born on September 14, 1955 in Chicago, Illinois, to Louis Marius Prevost, of French and Italian descent, and Mildred Martínez, of Spanish descent. He has two brothers, Louis Martín and John Joseph. He studied first at the Minor Seminary of the Augustinian Fathers and then at Villanova University in Pennsylvania, where in 1977 he earned a Degree in Mathematics and Philosophy.

In 1977, Prevost entered the novitiate of the Order of Saint Augustine (O.S.A.) in Saint Louis. He made his first profession on September 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1978. On August 29<sup>th</sup> 1981, he made his solemn vows. At the age of 27, he was sent by his superiors to Rome to study Canon Law at the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas. He was ordained a priest on June 19<sup>th</sup> 1982, at the Augustinian College of Saint Monica by Archbishop Jean Jadot.

He went as a missionary to Trujillo, Peru in 1988 and he spent 11 years there in total. In 1999, he was elected Provincial Prior of the Augustinian Province of "Mother of Good Counsel" in Chicago, and two and a half years later, the ordinary General Chapter of the Order of Saint Augustine, elected him as Prior General, confirming him in 2007 for a second term.

On September 26, 2015, he was appointed Bishop of Chiclayo, Peru by Pope Francis. Pope Francis created him Cardinal in the Consistory of September 30, 2023. He served in several Vatican Dicasteries (Departments). His most recent appointment was as a member of the Congregation for Bishops, the Vatican Department that oversees the worldwide appointment of Bishops.

His personal motto as Bishop, and now as Pope, is "In Illo uno unum"—words pronounced by Saint Augustine in a sermon on Psalm 127 to explain that "although we Christians are many, in the one Christ we are one."

The formal Mass of Inauguration of his Petrine Ministry is today (18/05) in St. Peter's Square. On the following Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May, Pope Leo XIV will preside over a Eucharistic Celebration at the Archbasilica of St. John Lateran at 5 PM. This Mass will include the formal installation of the Pope on the *Cathedra Romana*, the episcopal see of the Bishop of Rome.

His choose to be named after Pope Leo XIII who was Pope from 1878 until his death in 1903. Pope Leo XIII wrote the prayer to Blessed Michael the Archangel, published 12 documents on the importance of the rosary and an important document called "Rerum Novarum" which addresses the social and economic issues arising from the Industrial Revolution. It emphasizes the rights of workers and advocates for a just society based on Christian principles. We pray that he will have a long and fruitful ministry, and we entrust him to Our Blessed Mother and St. Michael. Please keep the new pope and his intentions in your prayers.
